




















There is a good range of subjects available to my child at this school.



I am hopeful with the easing of covid 19 restrictions the children will be able to engage in clubs again and other events at the school. The children have missed out a great deal the last year and I hope the coming year into next we will be able to make up for the lost time.

As a parent of a new child in reception there are times when I would have appreciated a little more information about the set up of the school day, both in the classroom and the wider school. We may have missed a lot of this because of Covid but Ella will go into further years and we will

still have missed that opportunity to learn about the school and it will probably be presumed we know more than we do! Also the expectations (even through, Covid times) and what she should be achieving.

I think the staggered pick up and drop offs have been great, I can imagine they have eased congestion. I would be happy for them to stay as long as the school day was not shortened in anyway.

This is a very caring school that has gone above what i would expect to support my child.

Since attending this school my son has made significant progress in his learning, in comparison to his previous school. I am very happy with St Paul's and have a happy content child.

In regards to progress and measuring how our child is doing this is difficult as we have never received the assessment reports promised by the school around Christmas 2020. It's difficult to benchmark without knowing this or what the expectations are for their age. We recognise that this information has been discussed via the recent parent consultations but this was brief and reports were promised before Christmas and information about my child's progress would be helpful via a report of some nature to refer to.

It was helpful to receive additional materials from the teacher to support our child when it was bought to our attention that she needed extra support in phonics at the parent consultation .

In respect to the bullying we don't consider the issue we had to be particularly of this nature although have reported an incident we are happy was dealt with. The 'terminology' on this question could be misleading.

We do have concerns over being made aware of what our child is learning and do not believe everything being loaded onto a portal/school website to find information isn't always clear. The previous communication in birch via the contact book was much more efficient.

We appreciate COVID has had a huge impact however we feel that generally communication from the school has been lacking during this period when it is needed most. Often multiple channels of communication are used which can create confusion. It feels like it's much more difficult to communicate or discuss these issues directly with the members of staff where previously this wasn't the case.

We also feel it is unclear what is happening in regard to Mr Hulme being the executive head. We feel this has a detrimental effect. Is it going to continue? It also feels unclear regarding the arrangements for Miss Searles departure.

Despite our comments here, we are generally satisfied with the school but feel minor changes could have a big impact to improve our day to day experience with the school and ultimately benefit our child's learning.

All things considered I think the school has done very well over the past few months. In many ways we also prefer some of the changes: perhaps due to the hand washing class wide, our child has been ill much less. We prefer the staggered drop offs and pick ups. Parents evening is easier to attend. PE kits are not going missing. There have been less activities but that's understandable in the circumstances. My child is happy and doing well. Keep it up St Paul's staff!

If the children receive gold for the day. It would be nice for them and their parents to show they did get gold. Maybe a little gold sticker as a suggestion
