Dear Parents/Carers,

Swimming Lessons at the New White Oaks Leisure Centre for Years 1 and 2

We are really pleased to have been able to secure swim lessons at the brand new pools at White Oaks Leisure Centre, for our Year 1 and 2 children. This will be for half an hour, every Wednesday afternoon. The first session will be on **Wednesday 20th April 2022** and the last session will be on **Wednesday 25th May 2022**. We will travel to and from White Oaks via the school minibus.

The cost of the sessions will be **£26.00** per child, which covers the hire of two pools, teaching and main, three swimming instructors and transport to and from the Centre. The children will receive a total of 6 swim lessons, which equates to approximately £4.33 per swim session, including travel. **Payment should be made via our School Gateway platform under 'Y1-2 Swim Lessons'**. Payment can be made per session, but you must pay for all 6 sessions, even if your child does not attend all of them. **We will leave the payment open until Tuesday 18th May 2022.**

Please ensure your child brings the following items in a suitable bag (no shampoo or hair gel please):

Boys – swimming trunks, a towel, a swimming hat and goggles are advised.

Girls – one-piece swimming costume (girls in two pieces will not be allowed to swim), a towel, swimming hat and goggles are recommended.

Please discuss with your child their level of swimming ability, so that they are able to let their class teacher know or put a note in their contact books, in preparation for their first swimming lesson. They will be grouped according to ability, on their first lesson at White Oaks. If your child has any medical conditions that may affect his/her ability to participate, please contact Mrs Doherty in the School Office, to let us know as soon as possible.
