

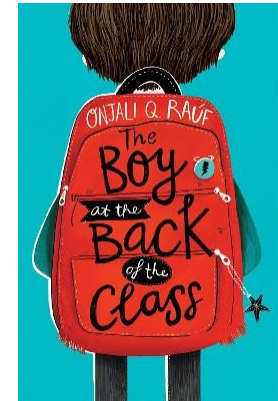

Maple—Term 3

English	The Boy at the Back of the Class , this touching novel conveys the seriousness of the situation while maintaining a humorous tone when describing the scrapes they get into while trying to accomplish their mission. The children will develop an insight and appreciation of the challenges of a refugee experiences.
Maths	This term we will explore multitude of mathematical concepts consisting of decimals, fractions, percentages, area and perimeter. The children will be using their prior knowledge, manipulatives and strategies to aid their learning when using all operations and applying them to larger numbers.
Science	The children will identify and name main parts of the circulatory system, describe the functions of the heart, blood vessels and blood, recognise the impact of diet, exercise, drugs and lifestyle on the body and describe how nutrients are transported.
Geography	The children will learn about how many people live on the planet and where they are distributed. Also, they will look into why population changes and what a population pyramid is. Furthermore, the children will explore the challenges a growing or ageing population faces.
Art/DT	In this pathway, the children will engage in creating mechanisms with wheels and axels. They will learn to design and build structures, understand the principles of movement and rotation. The project encourages problem-solving, precision in measurements and hands-on application of engineering concepts.
Music	During this term, the children will receive ukulele lessons where they will practice strumming and rhythms. Also, they will take part in regular singing practice. This is an opportunity to work together as a whole-school choir and consider things like harmonies and melodies. We will be practicing for 'Young Voices' at the o2.
Computing	In this unit, we will be learning-- about creating blogs. We will start exploring what a blog is, the features and the purpose of writing them. We will focus on how to plan, create and present their own blogs. By doing this we will learn how to contribute to an existing blog and the importance of commenting on them.
RE	This term, we will explore the question 'What difference does the resurrection make to Christians?'. The children will explore the concepts of sacrifice, resurrection, salvation , incarnation and hope using theological terms. They will look at connections between the Christian belief of resurrection and how they worship on Good Friday and Easter Sunday.
PE	During PE the children will be focusing on developing their volleyball skills. The children will explore and learn the correct techniques to pass, serve and set when playing volleyball. In addition, we will also learn how get into scoring positions by spiking and blocking the ball.

The Boy at the Back of the Class is a child's perspective on the refugee crisis, highlighting the importance of friendship and kindness in a world that doesn't always make sense.

When a new boy joins their class, a group of children try to befriend him. They soon learn that Ahmet is a refugee and has been separated from his family. None of the grown-ups seem to be able to help him, so the friends come up with a daring plan, embarking on an extraordinary adventure.
