We are delighted to share an exciting opportunity for all children from Year 1 to Year 6. As part of the Into Film Festival, every child will have the chance to enjoy a special cinema trip—completely free of charge!

The visits have been organised as follows:

- **Maple Class** – *Stag Community Arts Centre* to see *How to Train Your Dragon* (PG) on **Thursday 13th November 2025**.
- **Beech Class** – *Cineworld Bexleyheath* to see *Sonic the Hedgehog* (PG) on **Tuesday 18th November 2025**.
- **Oak Class** – *Cineworld Bexleyheath* to see *Garfield: The Movie* (U) on **Thursday 27th November 2025**.

The Into Film Festival is the UK's largest free celebration of film and education. It provides children and young people with the chance to experience the magic of the big screen, often for the very first time. The festival is designed to inspire creativity, broaden cultural understanding, and spark a love of storytelling, while also linking films to themes within the curriculum such as literacy, history, and personal development.

Please note that the films chosen for Maple and Beech classes are rated **PG (Parental Guidance)**. This means that while the films are generally suitable for children, some scenes may be unsuitable for younger viewers. We believe these films are appropriate for our pupils, but we are asking parents and carers to let us know if they have any concerns about their child attending.

All transport and tickets are being provided, so there will be no cost to families. Further details regarding timings, travel arrangements, and what children will need on the day will be shared closer to the trip.

We are very much looking forward to these enjoyable visits and to seeing the children's enthusiasm as they take part in this inspiring national festival.
