Dear Parents/Carers,

Y6 Bikeability Cycle Training: Thursday 26th February – Tuesday 3rd & Wednesday 4th March 2026

Bikeability is a National Standard cycle training course comprising of 3 levels, designed to give the next generation of children, the skills and confidence to ride their bikes on today's roads. This is an important skill, especially as the children begin to travel to secondary school and become more independent with their friends.

We have organised cycle proficiency sessions for all our Year 6 students at school, which usually costs £15. This year we are pleased to let you know, that the training will be completely FREE. The training will cover Levels 1 and 2 and will teach the children how to control their bikes, to make manoeuvres safely and improve hazard awareness. It will show them how to complete basic cycle safety checks, improve their knowledge of important road signs and increase their observational skills when cycling on the road.

The course requires your child to use their own bike and bike helmet and these should be brought to school on the two days that your child takes part in their training. The children will be grouped into A and B and we will advise you what group your child will be in, closer to the training. The sessions will run as follows:

Date/Time	Group	Session
Thursday 26th February 2026 All day 09:00 – 15:00	The whole of Year 6 will take part split into groups A&B. GROUP A (AM) & GROUP B (PM)	Level 1 – training on the playground fully supervised.
Tuesday 3rd March 2026 All day 09:00 – 15:00	Group A Only All Day	Level 2 – training on the playground and School Lane all day, fully supervised.
Wednesday 4th March 2026 All day 09:00 – 15:00	Group B Only - All Day	Level 2 – training on the playground and School Lane all day, fully supervised.

I have attached a 'Parents Handbook' for you to read through before the course and a '**Parental Consent QR Code**' and URL. **The consent form MUST be completed by Friday 16th January 2026. Please note that your child will not be able to take part in the course, unless the consent form has been completed.**
